Adjutant's Message

Comrades,

This month a new light is upon us as now our membership requirements have changed. This change in the plans for years now has come to light. Now every service member from 7 Dec 1941 to present is eligible for membership in the Legion and has received an honorable discharge or currently still serving. Our membership is our strength to the Nation in getting the needed benefits and services that our veterans and current members have earned. Also, to correct the errors of our gov't in illnesses that have been a result of our service in various areas of the world or certain duty stations. This by making those errors corrected by the VA offering the proper medical services needed to support our comrades.

Our need as the Legion is for all of our membership to reach out to other former and current service members to be Legionnaires. It is in that strength of membership, as well as, the community involvement that our Post and other posts have to demonstrate our service to veterans, youth and general populace.

Just last week President Trump made an Executive Order to expedite the Total Permanent Disability discharge program, for veterans who are totally and permanently disabled due to a service-related condition are eligible to have their federal student loan debt completely cancelled, tax-free. This law that has been on the books has been held down in bureaucracy for years and had been serious affecting many veteran families eligible because of the inability to sustain work to pay the loans. This would eliminate over 150 Million dollars of loan debt. The President was persuaded and advised of the problem by our National Committee and Commander about the problems of our veterans. Again, membership has power to influence.

Our Post currently needs our membership. To provide and assist in the programs of the American Legion. For our 4 pillars of service, to Veterans Affairs and Rehabilitation, Americanism, Child and Youth and National Security. Our strength in membership affect local and regional policies. We have our input in many areas that affect our community. We also need our membership to provide that community service to demonstrate our visibility and presence in the community programs but our programs also. These can be one and the same.

Please renew your 2020 dues and join us at the Post meeting to help up provide the programs we have been doing and could do more in the further.
